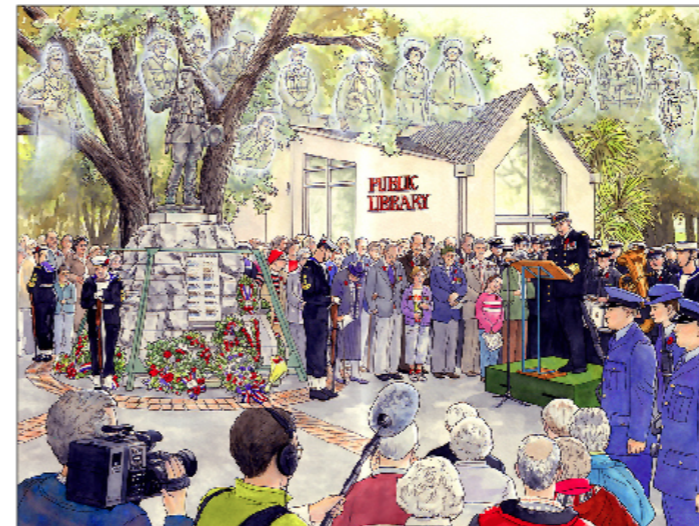


Year 8 Team 1 won the A Grade for Term 1 at the Glenfield waterpolo league.
